Special Olympics West Virginia (SOWV) is excited that your school has taken the steps to begin to, or continue to, offer quality social inclusion through the Unified Champion Schools (UCS) program.

Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools aims to promote social inclusion through intentionally planned and implemented activities affecting school-wide change. With sports as the foundation, the three-component model (Unified Sports/Activities, Inclusive Youth Leadership, and Whole School Engagement) offers a unique combination of effective activities that equip youth with tools and training to create climates of acceptance, where students with and without intellectual disabilities feel welcome, are included in, and feel a part of all activities, functions and opportunities.

This form registers your school with Special Olympics WV for the 2021-2022 school year. By completing the below, it is your school's commitment to inclusion, acceptance and respect of all students through the implementation of Unified Champions Schools (UCS). Your students and teachers will make efforts to continually improve as an inclusive community for everyone, especially students with intellectual disabilities (ID). Students with and without ID will be encouraged and empowered to lead the efforts to improve the climate at our school, with teachers and administrative support.

Unified Champion Schools®

Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools is a 3-component model that combines Unified Sports, Inclusive Youth Leadership and Whole School Engagement to create school and community climates of acceptance and inclusion.

The three components of Unified Champions School are:

- 1. **Inclusive/Unified Sports/PE or Activities**: Sports and/or PE, or other Unified Activities participation involving people with and without intellectual disabilities on the same team.
- 2. **Youth Leadership**: Newly formed clubs or existing school clubs which plan and implement inclusive activities.
- 3. Whole School Engagement: Campaigns, events or activities to encourage acceptance, respect and inclusion for all students. Example: Anti Bullying Campaign, Spread the Word Campaign, Special Olympics pep rally

Unified Champion School will:

- Have all Unified coaches (youth and adult) complete the free online National Federation of High School (NFHS) Unified Sports Coaches training.
- 1-2 staff liaisons to help with the implementation of the Unified Champion School program.
- Use the Special Olympics Unified Champion School logo on all printed materials including sport uniforms.
- Support student leadership roles to meet the criteria to be a Unified Champion School.
- Complete a mid-year and year-end online survey from UMass.
